




<p><b>FIRST ACTIVITY</b></p> <p>Please watch Michael Rosen perform his poem Chocolate Cake  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7BxQLITdOOc">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7BxQLITdOOc</a></p> <p>Then please ask your children the following questions to write in their books.</p> <p>-What is the poem about?  -When did he go and get some chocolate cake?  -What happened to the chocolate cake?  -How did his mum know it was him?</p>	<p><b>Tongue Twisters</b></p> <p>Michael Rosen's Chocolate Cake is full of playful phrases and interesting words. Tongue twisters are a great way to warm up for drama and are also very effective when encouraging children to feel more confident with language.</p> <p>Here is are some tongue twisters to try:  <b>The big beautiful blue balloon burst.</b>  <b>Cooks cook cupcakes quickly.</b>  <b>Betty bought butter but the butter was bitter, so Betty bought better butter to make the bitter butter better.</b></p>	<p><b>Drama Exercise</b></p> <p>Favourite Foods  Using the script on the website help your child to act out eating their favourite food. Encourage them to use facial expression as well as physical movements.</p>	<p><b>Wordsearch</b></p> <p>Find all the words in the wordsearch. Once you've found them can you use each word in your own sentence?  Wordsearch is available on the school website.</p>
