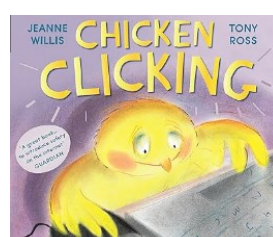
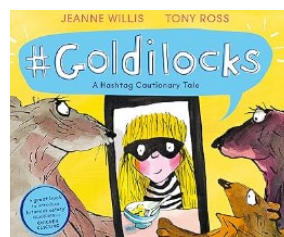
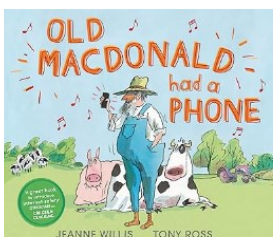


Safer Internet Day

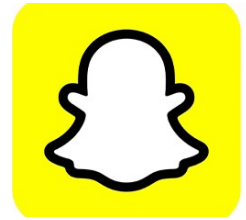

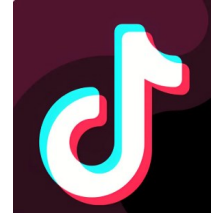
